CONVOCATION OF THE 125th ASSEMBLY OF THE INTER-PARLIAMENTARY UNION

Madam President,
Mr. President,

It is our pleasure to inform you that the 125th Assembly of the Inter-Parliamentary Union and related meetings will be held in Bern (Switzerland) at BERNEXPO from Sunday, 16 to Wednesday, 19 October 2011.

1. AGENDA

1. Election of the President and Vice-Presidents of the 125th Assembly

 - (b) Redistribution of power, not just wealth: Ownership of the international agendas

 - (c) Access to health as a basic right: The role of parliaments in addressing key challenges to securing the health of women and children
(Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights)
4. Report of the IPU Committee on United Nations Affairs
5. Amendments to the Statutes and Rules of the IPU

2. PANEL DISCUSSIONS RELATING TO THE STANDING COMMITTEES

On Tuesday, 18 October, three panel discussions will take place on the subject items to be discussed by the Standing Committees at the 126th Assembly.

The format and conduct of these panel discussions will be largely informal, with the focus on debate and interaction. They will be moderated by two or more experts. The co-Rapporteurs will also make very brief (maximum five minutes) presentations of their draft report.

The aim of these panel discussions is to help raise the awareness of IPU Members of the subjects on the agenda of the 126th Assembly. There will be no negotiations as such and all prepared speeches setting out formal positions are highly discouraged.

The panel discussions also offer participants an opportunity to provide comments and suggestions on the preliminary draft reports that have been prepared by the co-Rapporteurs. This will provide the co-Rapporteurs with an intermediary checkpoint halfway through the drafting process and help them to enrich their reports and recommendations.

3. PANEL DISCUSSION ON REFORM OF THE FINANCIAL MARKETS

At each second Assembly of the year, a panel discussion is organized on the Tuesday. At the Bern Assembly, a panel discussion on *Reform of the financial markets* will take place on 18 October.

4. IPU COMMITTEE ON UNITED NATIONS AFFAIRS

This Committee will meet all day on Monday, 17 October, and in the morning of Wednesday, 19 October. The Committee will hold a Debate on *Nuclear Weapons – the Road to Zero*, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on the first day. A hearing with former Portuguese President Jorge Sampaio, High Representative of the UN Alliance of Civilizations, is scheduled from 2.30 p.m. to 4.30 p.m. on 17 October. There will also be briefings on the parliamentary contribution to major UN events in 2011, on preparations for the 2012 UN Summit on Sustainable Development and on preparations for the UN General Assembly debate on *Interaction between the United Nations, national parliaments and the Inter-Parliamentary Union*.

5. TIMETABLE *

The timetable of the Assembly is set out in [Annex I](#). The closing sitting of the 125th Assembly will take place on Wednesday, 19 October, from **4 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.** During this sitting, the report on a possible emergency item included in the Assembly agenda will be presented and the draft resolution submitted for adoption. Delegations are kindly requested to bear this in mind when making their travel arrangements.

6. EMERGENCY ITEM

According to Assembly Rule 11 and Article 14.2 of the Statutes, any Member of the IPU may request the inclusion of an emergency item in the Assembly agenda. If the Assembly so decides, the emergency item will be debated by the Assembly on Monday, 17 October 2011. Provision has also been made on the following day for a possible meeting of a drafting committee to prepare a draft resolution.

7. PARTICIPATION

Each IPU Member may appoint a maximum of five delegates to the second annual session of the Assembly, or seven for parliaments of countries with a population of 100 million inhabitants or more. Any delegation that, for three consecutive Assemblies, is composed exclusively of parliamentarians of the same sex, will, however, automatically be reduced by one person.

Please note that the number of additional MPs accompanying delegations as Advisers must not exceed two.

IPU Members whose arrears equal or exceed the amount of the contributions due from them for the preceding two full years may not be represented by more than two delegates at meetings of the IPU (Article 5.2 of the Statutes).

Associate Members may participate in the Assembly and its Standing Committees with the same rights as Members, save the right to vote and to present candidates for elective office.

International organizations and other bodies invited by the Governing Council to be represented at the Assembly as **observers** are entitled to send a **maximum of two delegates**.

8. STEERING COMMITTEE

The Steering Committee of the Assembly shall be composed of the President of the Assembly, the President of the Inter-Parliamentary Union and the Vice-President of the Executive Committee. The Presidents of the Standing Committees may take part in its work in an advisory capacity.

The Steering Committee, assisted by the IPU Secretary General, is mandated to take all appropriate measures to ensure the effective organization and smooth running of the Assembly proceedings.

9. VICE-PRESIDENTS OF THE ASSEMBLY

According to Rule 7.3 of the Assembly Rules, each delegation is entitled to designate one of its members as a Vice-President. Some of them will be called upon to replace the President of the Assembly during a sitting or part thereof.

Delegations are requested to include the name of the person from their delegation who has been designated as a Vice-President of the Assembly when submitting their registration form and, in any case, upon arrival at the IPU Registration Service.

10. TABLE SHOWING THE ALLOCATION OF VOTES

A provisional table showing the votes allocated to delegations at the 125th Assembly is contained in Annex II.

Members are kindly requested to check the figures concerning them and, if necessary, inform the IPU Secretariat in Geneva in writing of any modifications required, preferably in advance of the sessions. The final table showing the allocation of votes at the Assembly will be distributed at the opening session.

11. LANGUAGES

The IPU Secretariat will provide simultaneous interpretation into and from the organization's two official languages: English and French, as well as Arabic and Spanish, at the meetings of all statutory bodies.

Three other interpretation channels have been reserved for Chinese, Japanese and Russian at sittings of the Assembly, the Governing Council, and for the Panel discussions.

Delegates may, exceptionally, use another language provided that they arrange for their speech to be interpreted into one of the IPU's official languages, and that copies of the speech are given to the Chief Interpreter (Ms. F. Steinig-Huang) well in advance, and no later than two hours before it is to be delivered.

12. MEETINGS OF OTHER BODIES

Other bodies will hold meetings during the Assembly; their members will be convened by way of a separate letter. They include:

- The Governing Council (17 and 19 October, public sittings);
- The Executive Committee (14, 15 and 18 October, *in camera*);
- The Coordinating Committee of Women Parliamentarians (16 October, *in camera*);
- The Gender Partnership Group (15 and 18 October, *in camera*);
- The Committee on the Human Rights of Parliamentarians (15, 16, 17 and 18 October, *in camera*);
- The Committee on Middle East Questions (16 October, *in camera*);
- The IPU Committee on United Nations Affairs (17 and 19 October, public sittings).

The Association of Secretaries General of Parliaments (ASGP) will also meet at BERNEXPO during the Assembly. It will be convened by its President.

POST-ASSEMBLY MEETINGS – 20 OCTOBER 2011

International conference on effective capacity-building programmes for parliamentarians, organized by the IPU, the ASGP and Monash University; detailed information on the conference, including its Convocation, will be sent out shortly to all Member Parliaments.

13. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON THE SESSION

Further information concerning the session will be provided in the Assembly Guidebook and in the "Additional information concerning the organization of the Assembly" document, which will be distributed to delegations upon registration.

Every day during the Assembly, participants will find in all meeting rooms and at the Registration and Information desk the *Journal*, which provides the latest updates on the programme of meetings and other important information designed to facilitate their participation in the proceedings of the session.

14. RESULTS OF THE ASSEMBLY

All delegations will receive two printed copies of the *Results* of the 125th Assembly. In addition, the document will be accessible on the IPU website (<http://www.ipu.org>) two weeks after the close of the Assembly, when a complete electronic version of the "Results" can be downloaded in PDF format.

15. DELEGATES' STAY IN BERN
