CONVOCATION OF THE 127th ASSEMBLY OF THE INTER-PARLIAMENTARY UNION

Madam President,
Mr. President,

It is our pleasure to inform you that the 127th Assembly of the Inter-Parliamentary Union and related meetings will be held in Quebec City (Canada) at the Quebec City Convention Centre (QCCC) from Sunday, 21 to Friday, 26 October 2012.

2. TIMETABLE *

The timetable of the Assembly is set out in [Annex I](#). The Inaugural Ceremony will take place on Sunday, 21 October at 6.30 p.m., with all delegates requested to be seated by 6 p.m. latest. The last sitting of the Governing Council, with its operational and budget-related decisions, will be held on Wednesday, 24 October, from 2 to 6.30 p.m. The closing sitting of the 127th Assembly will take place on Friday, 26 October from 2.30 to 4 p.m. During this sitting, the report on an emergency item included in the Assembly agenda will be presented and the draft resolution submitted for adoption. In addition, the outcome documents of the Special debate, the IPU Committee on United Nations Affairs and the Special session on gender-sensitive parliaments will be submitted to the Assembly for adoption.

3. EMERGENCY ITEM

According to Assembly Rule 11 and Article 14.2 of the Statutes, any Member of the IPU may request the inclusion of an emergency item in the Assembly agenda. If the Assembly so decides, the emergency item will be debated by the Assembly in the afternoon of Monday, 22 October 2012. Provision has also been made on the following day for a meeting of a drafting committee to prepare a draft resolution.

4. PANEL DISCUSSIONS

During the week of the Assembly, three panel discussions will take place on the subject items to be taken up by the Standing Committees at the 128th Assembly. The format and conduct of these panel discussions will be largely informal, with the focus on debate and interaction. The co-Rapporteurs will present their draft report(s), and experts will be invited to contribute to the debate.

The aim of these panel discussions is to help raise awareness and stimulate an exchange of views among IPU Members. They will also offer an opportunity for Members to provide comments and suggestions on the preliminary draft reports, as well as reflect on possible elements to be included in the subsequent draft resolutions. In light of the foregoing, the reading of prepared speeches setting out formal positions is highly discouraged.

In addition to the three panel discussions on the subject items under consideration by the three IPU Standing Committees, the Quebec City Assembly will also feature a number of other interactive panel sessions. These will cover a series of topical issues, including:

- Creating opportunities for youth in today's global economy;
- Building peace after conflict;
- Parliamentary immunity: Benefit or burden;
- Peak oil and prospects for energy security; and
- Parliamentary and political law.

Concept notes with additional information on all of these panels will be made available on the websites of both the IPU and the host Parliament.

5. IPU COMMITTEE ON UNITED NATIONS AFFAIRS

The IPU Committee on United Nations Affairs will meet in the afternoon of Monday, 22 October, for a roundtable discussion focusing on multilateralism and the role of parliamentary diplomacy, with the participation of leaders of regional parliamentary organizations. The Committee will hold a special session in the morning of Wednesday, 24 October, on the occasion of United Nations Day, and will conclude its work in the morning of Thursday, 25 October 2012.

In keeping with its mandate, the Committee will hold hearings with senior UN officials, review the implementation of specific international commitments, and help shape a parliamentary perspective and contribution to major UN processes currently under way. The full agenda of the Committee on United Nations Affairs will be made available in the coming weeks.

6. SPECIAL GENDER PARTNERSHIP SESSION

A Special gender partnership session will be held during the Quebec City Assembly, aimed at providing a platform for members of parliament to discuss what constitutes gender-sensitive parliaments and identify objectives and concrete strategies for the achievement of such institutions. The Special session will be organized in three half-day sittings, with debates held in plenary as well as in working groups, and will result in the development of a Plan of Action for Gender-sensitive Parliaments. A balanced participation of both men and women parliamentarians will be sought throughout the proceedings of the Special session.

Delegations are, therefore, encouraged to access the online registration facility at: www.ipu2012uip.ca/registration/ and to indicate the names of at least one man parliamentarian and one woman parliamentarian who will be attending the Special gender partnership session.

7. SPECIAL DEBATE (Item 3 of the agenda)

The theme of the Quebec Assembly Special debate is *Citizenship, identity and linguistic and cultural diversity in a globalized world*. The economic, political, social, and cultural challenges arising from globalization are dominating the attention of people and leaders around the world. From the incongruity between existing international institutions and emerging States to economic disparities and environmental degradation, disrupted social linkages, explosive population growth and urbanization, the challenges of globalization are becoming increasingly acute and complex, thereby demanding urgent action.

This topic will be addressed in four plenary sessions, each of which will begin with an address by a high-profile keynote speaker on one of the following sub-themes:

- Protecting diversity as a global value;
- The challenge of respecting diversity while building social cohesion;
- Enhancing political participation and representation of minorities and indigenous groups; and
- Best practices and innovative ideas for managing citizenship in a globalized and rapidly changing environment.

Speaking time for the Special debate

The list of speakers will commence with those Presiding Officers of Parliament wishing to take the floor, followed by first speakers, and concluding with those delegates registered as second speakers. In order to allow for the broadest possible participation, delegates are requested to limit their interventions to 6 minutes.

Registration of speakers for the Special debate

Registration will take place on the Assembly premises at the speakers' registration desk. This desk will be opened 24 hours before the beginning of the first plenary of the Assembly, as of 11 a.m. on Sunday, 21 October 2012.

Unless changes are announced during the Assembly, the registration service is open from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 2 to 6 p.m. on both Sunday, 21 October and Monday, 22 October.

- **Pre-registration**

Members also have the option to pre-register for the Special debate by using the attached "Speakers pre-registration form". The form should be returned to the IPU Secretariat by no later than 6 p.m. (Swiss time) on Friday, 12 October 2012. After that date, all registrations must be made on the spot at the Assembly venue, as of 11 a.m., on Sunday, 21 October 2012.

- **Delegations of Members and Associate Members**

The Secretariat will record the names of delegates who wish to take the floor, distinguishing between first and second speakers from delegations of Members and Associate Members. Registration may be made in person or through another member of the delegation.

- **Delegations of Observers**

Observers are entitled to register one speaker only in plenary debates of the IPU Assembly and its Standing Committees.

Each programme and organ of the United Nations is entitled to register one speaker.

- **List of speakers**

At 6 p.m. on Sunday, 21 October, the Secretariat will determine the order of speakers by a public drawing of lots. The list will be made public as soon as possible after the drawing of lots so that delegates have sufficient advance notice of when they will be called to address the Special debate.

8. PARTICIPATION

Following the Governing Council's decision in Kampala and in order to allow for members of parliament who may have a special interest in the panel sessions on the fourth and fifth days to join their delegation, exceptionally for the Quebec Assembly, each IPU Member may appoint the same number of delegates as for the first Assembly of the year.

Consequently, each delegation may comprise a maximum of eight MPs, or ten for parliaments of countries with a population of 100 million inhabitants or more. Any delegation which, for three consecutive sessions of the Assembly, is composed exclusively of parliamentarians of the same sex will, however, be automatically reduced by one person. Please note that the number of additional MPs accompanying delegations as Advisers must not exceed two.

Member Parliaments are encouraged to systematically include young members of parliament in their delegations to IPU Assemblies and other meetings. A separate meeting of young parliamentarians will be held during the Assembly in the afternoon of Monday, 22 October.

IPU Members whose arrears equal or exceed the amount of the contributions due from them for the preceding two full years may not be represented by more than two delegates at meetings of the IPU (Article 5.2 of the Statutes).

Associate Members may participate in the Assembly and its Standing Committees with the same rights as Members, with the exception of the right to vote and to present candidates for elective office.

International organizations and other bodies invited by the Governing Council to be represented at the Assembly as Observers are entitled to send a maximum of two delegates.

9. STEERING COMMITTEE

The Steering Committee of the Assembly is composed of the President of the Assembly, the President of the Inter-Parliamentary Union and the Vice-President of the Executive Committee. The Presidents of the Standing Committees may take part in its work in an advisory capacity.

The Steering Committee, assisted by the IPU Secretary General, is mandated to take all appropriate measures to ensure the effective organization and smooth running of the Assembly proceedings.

10. VICE-PRESIDENTS OF THE ASSEMBLY

According to Rule 7.3 of the Assembly Rules, each delegation is entitled to designate one of its members as a Vice-President. Some of them will be called upon to replace the President of the Assembly during a sitting or part thereof.

Delegations are requested to include the name of the person from their delegation who has been designated as a Vice-President of the Assembly when submitting their Delegation form and, in any case, upon their arrival at the IPU Registration Service.

11. TABLE SHOWING THE ALLOCATION OF VOTES

A provisional table showing the votes allocated to delegations at the 127th Assembly is contained in [Annex II](#).

Members are requested to check their respective allocations and to inform the IPU Secretariat in writing of any necessary modifications, preferably in advance. The final table for the allocation of votes at the Assembly will be distributed at the opening of the session.

12. LANGUAGES

The IPU Secretariat will provide simultaneous interpretation into and from the Organization's two official languages: English and French, as well as Arabic and Spanish, at the meetings of all statutory bodies.

Three other interpretation channels have been reserved for Chinese, Japanese and Russian at sittings of the Assembly, the Governing Council, and for the Panel discussions.

Delegates may, exceptionally, use another language provided that they arrange for their speech to be interpreted into one of the IPU's official languages, and that copies of the speech are given to the Chief Interpreter (Ms. F. Steinig-Huang) well in advance, and no later than two hours before it is to be delivered.

13. MEETINGS OF OTHER BODIES

The following bodies will also meet during the Assembly:

- Governing Council (22 and 24 October, public sittings);
- Executive Committee (19, 20 and 23 October, *in camera*);
- Sub-Committee on Finance (18 October, *in camera*);
- Coordinating Committee of Women Parliamentarians (21 October, *in camera*);
- Gender Partnership Group (20 and 23 October, *in camera*);
- Committee on the Human Rights of Parliamentarians (20, 21, 22 and 23 October, *in camera*);
- Committee on Middle East Questions (21 October, *in camera*);
- Committee to Promote Respect for International Humanitarian Law (25 October, *in camera*);
- HIV/AIDS Advisory Group (23 October, *in camera*).

The Association of Secretaries General of Parliaments (ASGP) will also meet at the QCCC during the Assembly. A joint IPU-ASGP session will be held all day on 26 October, and will focus on *Parliamentary representation and communication and the role of social media*.

14. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON THE SESSION

Further information concerning the session will be provided in the Assembly Guidebook and in the "Additional information concerning the organization of the Assembly" document, which will be distributed to delegations upon registration.

Journal

Every day during the Assembly, participants will find in all meeting rooms and at the Registration and Information Desk the *Journal*, which provides the latest updates on the programme of meetings and other important information designed to facilitate their participation in the proceedings of the session.

15. RESULTS OF THE ASSEMBLY

All delegations will receive two printed copies of the *Results* of the 127th Assembly. In addition, the document will be accessible on the IPU website (<http://www.ipu.org>) two weeks after the close of the Assembly, when a complete electronic version of the "Results" can be downloaded in PDF format. The Summary Records of the proceedings of the 127th Assembly will also be made available on the IPU website within three months of the closing of the Assembly.

16. REGISTRATION OF DELEGATES

It would be appreciated if all participants could adhere strictly to the registration deadline of 7 September 2012. All delegates are kindly requested to register with the online facility put in place by the host Parliament at <http://www.ipu2012uip.ca/registration/>. The online registration forms will allow delegates to submit relevant information regarding their travel to Canada, including their time of arrival and departure, hotel choices and passport details to expedite the issuance of visas, etc.

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
