Interactive debate on *Shaping a new system of water governance: Promoting parliamentary action on water*

15 October 2014 (2.30 – 5.30 p.m.)

Concept note

Background: This interactive debate will be organized around the theme of the future resolution, expected to be adopted by the Committee at the 132nd IPU Assembly in Hanoi.

Specifically, the session will address the following questions:

- What is the importance of transboundary cooperation on water? What results have been achieved so far and what challenges remain?
- What is the role of parliaments in ensuring effective water governance at the national, regional and global levels?
- What forms can parliamentary action take to support water-related interministerial collaboration?
- What parliamentary strategies exist to ensure respect for the human right to water?
- How can parliaments effectively deal with multiple issues affecting water governance, such as biodiversity, agriculture, industry and human needs?

Expected outcomes: The debate will provide the Committee with an opportunity to learn about current issues related to water governance and exchange views with key actors in this area. It will also provide the co-Rapporteurs with ideas and information to be included in the draft resolution.

Format: The session will take the form of an interactive debate between parliamentarians and experts on water governance. After introductory remarks by the panellists, the floor will be open for an exchange of views and questions and answers.
