

A parliamentary perspective on discrimination and violence against the girl child



New York, 1 March 2007

A parliamentary event organized by the Inter-Parliamentary Union and the United Nations Division for the Advancement of Women on the occasion of the 51st Session of the Commission on the Status of Women

INFORMATION NOTE

During the 51st Session of the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW), which will consider the "elimination of all forms of discrimination and violence against the girl-child", the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) and the United Nations Division for the Advancement of Women (UNDAW) are organising a parliamentary event entitled *A parliamentary perspective on discrimination and violence against the girl child*.

The meeting will take place on **1 March 2007**, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the **ECOSOC** chamber at UN Headquarters in New York.

Objectives

In keeping with its policy of contributing to major international forums by seeking to introduce a parliamentary dimension into the proceedings of intergovernmental organisations, the IPU is organising this one-day event with UNDAW in order to provide a forum for debate between parliamentarians from all over the world, and to contribute to the deliberations of the 51st CSW Session which will focus on the *Elimination of all forms of discrimination and violence against the girl-child*.

In cooperation with partner organisations, the event will aim to highlight the specific contribution of parliaments and the difference they can make in protecting and empowering the girl child while combating the discrimination and violence she faces. Parliamentarians will therefore be invited to share experiences and reflections on their role in protecting and supporting girl children. As detailed in the provisional agenda, the meeting will address two main topics: (1) Combating discrimination and violence against the girl child and (2) Empowering the girl child. Each general topic will be introduced by panellists, and will give rise to a general discussion.

Expected outcome

At the close of the meeting, a brief message to the CSW will be issued, stressing areas for future priority action, with particular emphasis on how parliaments can and should contribute to eliminating discrimination and violence against the girl child.

Participants

The participants in the Parliamentary Event will include:

- Parliamentarians present in New York for the 51st Session of the CSW as members of their respective national delegations. A letter of invitation will be sent by the IPU Secretary General to all Member and non-member parliaments of the IPU. Efforts will be made to encourage the participation of chairpersons and members of gender equality parliamentary committees.
- Representatives of governments, relevant organisations and funds of the UN system, and civil society will also be invited.

In keeping with normal practice, national delegations and diplomatic missions in New York will be invited to attend to all matters relating to visas, UN Badges, hotel reservations and transportation. <u>Participants must</u> therefore request their badge from thei<u>r country</u>'s <u>permanent mission to the United Nations</u>.
