# INFORMATION NOTE

During the 53<sup>rd</sup> Session of the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW), which will consider as its priority theme *The equal sharing of responsibilities between women and men, including caregiving in the context of HIV/AIDS*, the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) and the United Nations Division for the Advancement of Women (UNDAW) are organising a parliamentary event entitled "The Role of Parliaments in promoting equal sharing of responsibilities between women and men".

The meeting will take place on Wednesday 4 March 2009, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in Room 4 at UN Headquarters in New York.

## **Objectives**

In keeping with its policy of contributing to major international forums by seeking to introduce a parliamentary dimension into the proceedings of intergovernmental organisations, the IPU is organising this one-day event with UNDAW in order to provide a forum for debate between parliamentarians from all over the world, and to contribute to the deliberations of the  $53^{rd}$  CSW.

The meeting will place particular emphasis on the role of parliament and the contribution it can make in promoting a more balanced sharing of responsibilities between women and men, especially in the field of care giving. According to the Beijing Declaration, this balanced sharing is fundamental to the well-being of both men and women and of their families, and is central to the consolidation of democracy. The parliamentary event will therefore focus on what difference parliaments can make, in particular with regard to legislation, and how this can contribute to supporting a more balanced participation of women in politics.

## Expected outcome

At the close of the meeting, a brief message to the CSW will be issued, stressing areas for future priority action, with particular emphasis on how parliaments can and should contribute to financing gender equality and women's empowerment.

#### **Participants**

The participants in the parliamentary event will include:

- Parliamentarians present in New York for the 53<sup>rd</sup> Session of the CSW as members of their respective <del>national</del> delegations. A letter of invitation will be sent by the IPU Secretary General to all Member and non-member parliaments of the IPU. Efforts will be made to encourage the participation of chairpersons and members of gender equality parliamentary committees.
- Representatives of governments, relevant organisations and funds of the UN system, and civil society will also be invited.
